Hospitality Center seeks to provide all of the items necessary for a family experiencing homelessness to regroup, refocus, and work towards permanent housing
- [Pathway to Housing](#)
Pathway to Housing Program - case managers help connect those experiencing homelessness to their network of 80+ landlords to assist them to quickly secure permanent housing. They provide financial assistance to families in the form of a security deposit and first month rent initially. Once in housing, assistance is provided on a needs basis. Case Managers work diligently with families to assist them obtain employment, access benefits, and connect to community supports. Further, case managers strive to teach families soft skills that enable them to live independently and sustainably.

This shelter provides immediate crisis housing for women and women with children with Delaware Division of State Service Center housing voucher approval after emergencies such as house fires have left them homeless. The eight-unit, 23-bed Samaritan Housing provides up to 28 days of clean, safe housing along with meals, access to medical and dental care, mental health care, child care, job training/placement, help finding housing, free furniture and home goods – and services of an intake coordinator, case manager, resident manager and program director.

Women also have an opportunity to acquire skills in life management and parenting and also to use Ministry of Caring child care services. Their children receive educational and recreational enrichment throughout their stays. Case managers can easily connect women with services such as job training/placement assistance, medical and dental care and personal counseling.
