In this program participants work toward achieving the fiscal responsibility and life skills necessary to leave public housing and ultimately become a homeowner. By combining case-management and the coordination of services, WHA partners in collaboration with a number of local and state service providers to offer training, education, employment assistance, home ownership counseling, financial management, and Individual Development Account.
