Saint Francis Hospital provides patients with personal care that caters to mothers' and newborns' unique needs. If you already have insurance (or Medicaid) and want to schedule an OB doctor appointment, do the following:

- Go to OB clinic on 5th floor of medical office building attached to hospital & get a prescription for blood test to verify pregnancy
- Then, go to lab on 3rd floor for blood test
- The next day, call [302-421-4775](tel:302-421-4775) for your test results
- Once you have positive test results, your name will be placed on the nurses' call list. An OB triage nurse will call you to review your health history & schedule an OB appointment.

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[Delaware Health Care Connection](#)

The Health Care Connection (HCC) ensures access by uninsured individuals to primary care doctors, medical specialists, health promotion and disease prevention services; and helps with access to other health resources—including prescription programs, and laboratory and radiology services. HCC program staff are available to assist individuals with establishing a health care home, scheduling appointments, and removing barriers to obtaining healthcare and health promotion services. [Healthy Women, Healthy Babies](#)

A program for women who are Delaware residents. It facilitates extra services for women who are pregnant, planning to be pregnant or who just want to live healthier lives. These include personal health and wellness, nutrition, family planning, mental health, and prenatal care if you get pregnant.

[Smart Start](#)

This program provides in-home prenatal services to Medicaid eligible expectant women. Pregnant women can get help meeting their needs in obtaining social services and nutrition education.

Smart Start:

- Provides answers to questions about pregnancy, delivery and the early days after the birth of the baby.
- Helps expectant women choose the right foods to eat during pregnancy.

- Helps find resources in the community for needs such as housing, utilities, transportation or child care.
- Teaches an understanding of how the body changes during pregnancy and child birth.
- Teaches parenting skills.

[Fetal Alcohol Spectrum Disorders](#)

Fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASD) are a group of physical or behavioral conditions that can occur in a person whose mother drank alcohol during pregnancy. Alcohol in a pregnant woman's body crosses into the baby's blood, which can damage the developing brain and other organ systems and lead to FASD. They are 100% preventable if a pregnant woman avoids alcohol.
